Chapter 2, Section 8 (f), (e), (d)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-12	-Housekeeping and pharmacy address change procedures.
Chapter 2, Section 9 (b), (c)(v)(xi)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-13	-Clarifies PIC/staff pharmacist reporting responsibilities of pharmacy personnel reported to W.P.A.P. -Housekeeping -Requires expired drugs to be separated from active stock
Chapter 2, Section 10 (b)(ii)(D) (F), (c)(x)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-15	-Modifies prescription transfer requirements to require the phone number of the receiving pharmacy during transfer, and deletes the requirement to record the DEA number of a receiving pharmacy during transfer
Chapter 2, Section 11 (c)(v)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-17	-Modifies prescription labeling requirements for unit of issue packs
Chapter 2, Section 14	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-18	-Allows pharmacists the discretion to honor refills of a prescription after a known termination of the patient/practitioner relationship, for a period up to twelve months
Chapter 2, Section 20	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-22	-Deletes the requirement to keep a separate log book of prescriptions received via fax
Chapter 2, Section 25 (a)(iii)(iv)(v)(viii)(ix)(x)(xi)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 2-25	-Increases pharmacist, pharmacy intern, technician, resident retail pharmacy, non-resident pharmacy, institutional pharmacy license renewals to \$100, \$15, \$50, \$150, \$300, and \$150 respectively. Additionally initial licensure of technician is increased to \$50. License renewals for manufacturers, distributors, and wholesalers increase to \$250.

Chapter 3, Section 4 (c)(vii)(viii)(ix), (d), (e)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 3-2	-Housekeeping and addition/clarification of intern responsibilities/duties during internships and upon completion of internships

Chapter 6, Section 3	Pharmacy Act R&R page 6-1	-Housekeeping and Clarification of definitions applicable to continuing education
Chapter 6, Section 4	Pharmacy Act R&R page 6-1	-Housekeeping and requires pharmacists to maintain certificates of CE completion a period of two years from the date of reporting to the Board, and revokes the allowance of excess CE to be carried forward.
Chapter 6, Section 5	Pharmacy Act R&R page 6-2	-Deletes the requirement of pharmacists to submit certificates of completion for CE to the Board and allows pharmacists to only report CE hours -Exempts pharmacists with 'inactive' status from CE

Chapter 12, Section 12 (a), (d)	Pharmacy Act R&R page 12-7	-New paragraph creates procedures for institutional pharmacies providing off-site pharmaceutical care

Chapter 4, Section 3 (h)	Controlled Substance Act R&R page 4-2	-Authorizes the use of electronic 222 forms issued by the DEA
Chapter 6, Section 4	Controlled Substance Act R&R page 6-1	-Requires all non-verbal prescriptions for controlled substances to be issued on Board approved security paper, beginning Jan 1, 2007
Chapter 6, Section 11 (d)(e)(f)	Controlled Substance Act R&R page 6-4	-Shortens the expiration date of schedule II prescriptions to six months, requires schedule II prescriptions to be canceled upon dispensing, and clarifies allowable changes to schedule II prescriptions.
