A discrepancy was noted in proposed rules posted on board's website compared to those filed with LSO, Governor, Secretary of State, & AG's office. Rules posted on board's website were an earlier version of proposed rules. Rules discussed at this public hearing are the same as those provided in the rule-making package submitted to the state. Depending on time requirements either Kay McManus (1 <sup>st</sup> ) or Terry Carr (2 <sup>nd</sup> ) or Randy Harrop (3rd) will serve as the board's representative on this committee.

Prescription drug monitoring program	Denise Embury, Records Analyst, BOP, discussed the effect of the change in threshold for unsolicited profiles, which was made at the July meeting.	No action required.
Prescriptions from Washington Pharmacists	Discussed the email received from University of Washington, School of Pharmacy. Under prescriptive protocols in Washington, Steve Strockbine and Myrna Romack are considered mid-level practitioners with prescriptive authority to prescribe controlled substances. They do have a DEA number. The University of Washington is inquiring as to whether a controlled substance prescription written by either individual would be honored in Wyoming. Wyoming pharmacists are allowed to dispense prescriptions from practitioners from other states, but only to the extent a similar licensed practitioner could prescribe if practicing in Wyoming [Chapter 2, Section 19(d), Wyoming Pharmacy Act, R&R].	Based on current board rule, a controlled substance prescription written by Steve Strockbine or Myrna Romack may not be dispensed by a pharmacist in Wyoming. A letter will be sent from the Executive Director. To Elyse Tung, University of Washington, School of Pharmacy.
BFY 07-08 Budget	Executive Director presented status report of expenditures vs budget.	The Board to be updated at each Board meeting.
Prescription Drug Samples	Petra Abrams, RPh presented her case for the dispensing of samples in a retail pharmacy. In particular, Genoa Healthcare Pharmacy, located in Cheyenne. By board rule it is considered unprofessional conduct for a pharmacist to dispense or distribute drug samples (Chapter 2, Section 32, Wyoming Pharmacy Act, R&R)	Current board rule prohibits a pharmacist from dispensing or distributing prescription drug samples. No variance granted.
Collaborative Practice Agreements (CPA): Tonja J. Woods, PharmD	The Collaborative Practice Review Committee has reviewed the two CPA's and recommended approval by the Board if changes recommended were implemented by Dr. Woods. Dr. Woods has been contacted and will submit revised CPA's based on request by the review committee.	The board approved the CPA's between Tonja J. Woods, PharmD and Julie Carlson, MD and Jean Allais, MD.

Rule-Making 2008

Board discussed possible rule-making to consider for 2008 including:

- Chapter 2, Section 9 (number of hours required to serve as PIC)
- Chapter 8, Drug distributor rules
- Chapter 9, Patient Counseling/Prospective Drug Use Review
- Chapter 12, Section 22 (e) destruction of transdermal patches
- Chapter 7, Computer Regulations
- Chapter 4, Intern Regulations

The Board will decide at the January meeting. Chapter 8, Drug distributor rules will be revised because of the change in statute which became effective 7/1/2007.
