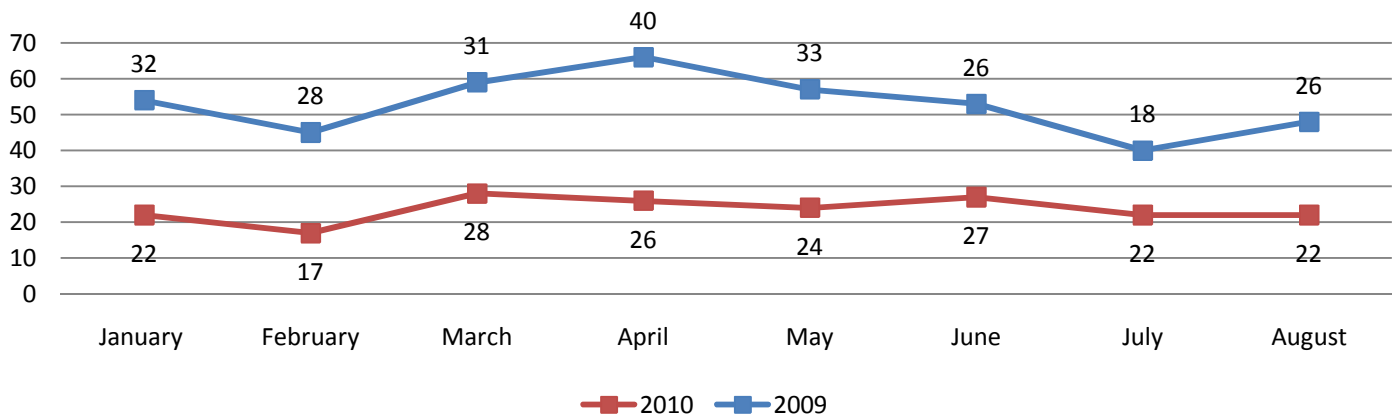

Wyoming Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)

The Wyoming Prescription Drug Monitoring Program was created in 2004 to help reduce addiction, diversion, and misuse of scheduled II, III, and IV including Tramadol and Carisoprodol prescription drugs in Wyoming. These two graphs below indicate the total number of Unsolicited Profiles commonly referred to as “Doctor Shopping” and the total number of profile requests made each month of the last three years. These two graphs correlate each other, the number of unsolicited profiles that the Board of Pharmacy generates each month is a direct result of the patient’s use of prescription drugs once a threshold has been met or exceeded. The profiles requested each month are from practitioners, law enforcement, regulatory boards, and registered pharmacists. The numbers of requested profiles are increasing while the numbers of unsolicited profiles are decreasing; *“doctor shopping”* is considered a form of diversion. The graph that illustrates the *Unsolicited Profiles* are in comparison to the first eight months of each year, what is significant about the number of profiles from 2009 to 2010 is that in 2010 Indian Health Services both the Arapahoe and Fort Washakie pharmacies are reporting, that did not happen last year. This is the first year ever that Indian Health Services are reporting their controlled substances to the Wyoming Prescription Drug Monitoring Program.
